

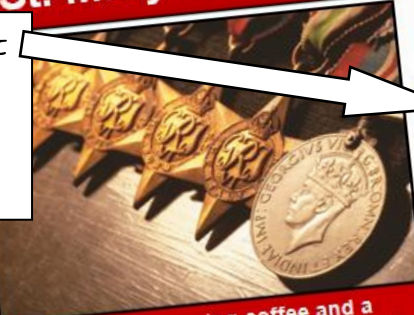
# Would you like a free colour poster to promote your next outing?

Back for a tasty Guardsman's lunch, and there's time to buy yourself any hot or cold drinks or desserts that you fancy on the day. Martin will bring out his authentic Bearskin and Colour Sergeant's Tunic for you to try on – so don't forget your camera!

Lord Mountbatten said that any regiment that was good at ceremony would be good on the battlefield and the regiments you'll hear about this afternoon are very good at both. Learn the correct identification (it's all in the buttons) and see the horses hanging their heads over a wall - 50

This entertaining day trip is devoted to the five regiments of Foot Guards and two regiments of Household Cavalry that make up HM's Household Division and enjoy the treasured privilege of guarding the Sovereign and the Royal Palaces. We visit the Guards Chapel and, in the afternoon, we'll attend the little known Punishment Parade! The day includes morning coffee and lunch (a hearty ham, egg & chips) in a lovely pub near the park.
